See you at the next meeting. Until then, happy stitching!--- Mary





February. We're bringing back Mini-demos. The demo will be 20 minutes, repeated three times so you will have an opportunity to sit in on all three demos. Barbara Sumlin will cover Basic Sewing Machine Maintenance, Dea Jae Shore will be demoing Machine Quilting with Templates and Jackie Randall will have a new ruler, Perfectly Pieced Pineapples.

March. Beth Helfter, evapaigequilts.com, quilt designer and instructor from Massachusetts. Beth has been quilting for 20 yrs. and featured in Quilter's World, The Quilter, Quiltmaker's 100 Blocks and other publications. Member of the 2014 Quiltmaker's "Scrap Squad". Her philosophy is "Inspired designs, relaxed attitude". Go to YouTube and watch a 3-part video by Beth on making accordion sewn scrappy half-square triangles. Friday workshop: "Syncopated Ribbons". You will need your sewing machine, an overflowing scrap bin, outside the box thinking and chocolate. Cost: \$35 plus \$8.00 pattern fee for a total of \$43.00. Saturday workshop: "Now You Give It A Scrap Slap". You will need to bring 81-3 in. squares. In class all the squares will be dumped into a pile and each student will pull squares for their block. All students will work the same block but in different value, colors, contrast, and placement. You will need a sewing machine. Cost: \$25.00 plus pattern fee of \$8.00 for a total of \$33.00.

April. Leslie Tucker Jenison, San Antonio, will be our teacher and lecturer. She is a designer for RJR fabrics. Has been quilting since the early 80's. Leslie is a published and award winning modern quilter. Friday workshop: "Move Over, Mondrian". The class modernizes the idea of a log cabin quilt. Cost: \$35.00. Saturday Workshop: "Intro to Improv". Improvisational piecing using three shades of gray. Cost \$25.00.

Jane Eayre Fryer was born in 1876 in Pennsylvania. She went to college in Massachusetts and became a school teacher of Latin, English, and Domestic Science (later called Home Economics) in New Jersey and Maryland. She wrote a series of books from 1912 to 1921 about a

young girl, Mary Frances.




In *The Mary Frances Sewing Book* Mary Frances learns to sew with help from *'Thimble People'* – Mr. Silver Thimble, Tommy Pin Cushion, etc. These inanimate objects come to life to befriend and aid Mary Frances. Fryer's idea was to teach home economics in a fanciful, entertaining way. Explicit instructions were included such as patterns for doll

clothing, and songs to sing while working. Other books included help from specific characters for each topic such as *The Mary Frances Cook Book* and the 'Kitchen People'; The Mary Frances Knitting and Crocheting Book and the

'Knitting People', etc. with a First Aid Book, a Garden Book, a Housekeeper Book (which included 2 sets of paper dolls and furniture), and a Story Book. Encouraging words are used throughout the books such as 'patience brings reward' and 'try, try again.'


The seven books were extremely popular and have been reproduced numerous times in the last 100 years. Families still find them relevant today with their whimsical way of teaching children.

A special 100th Anniversary publication in 2011 included updated doll clothing patterns to fit *American Girl* 18-inch dolls. A cd is available



Original and vintage copies of the Mary Frances books can be purchased online and at antique sales. All of the original versions can be read online at archive.org. Interestingly, in *The Mary Frances Cook Book* written in 1912, several recipes are included that were served on the April 10, 1912 voyage of the Titanic.

This committee has two projects: making quilts from memory blocks for Donate for Life in honor of organ donors, and making quilts for veterans, both for the Audie Murphy Memorial VA Hospital and for our own GSAQC veterans. Tone on tone red, white, and blue fabric is needed for the veteran quilts; please bring fabric to Barbara Sumlin if you have any to donate.


