


Small pieces of fabric similar to what is now called a handkerchief were used to shield the Chinese from the sun according to statues from 1,000 BC. Romans waved handkerchiefs in the coliseums and races began when the hankie was dropped. Knights carried a special lady's handkerchief into battle. Many portraits from the 1500s include handkerchiefs, such as this excerpt done by Moro of Queen Catherine of Portugal. Shakespeare wrote of handkerchiefs, and confusion over ownership resulted in the death of Othello and his wife.

These bits of fabric were not always used to wipe the face or nose, or douse with perfume to mask body odor. They were considered a valuable asset, often reserved for royalty. Louis XVI wrote a law that all handkerchiefs

had to be a square, and he prohibited anyone from carrying a hankie larger than his. Queen Victoria's hankies were embroidered with gold and silver thread. In 1843 James Fenimore Cooper wrote a short story about the life of high society women in '*The Autobiography of a Pocket Handkerchief*.'







Handkerchiefs have been made of cotton, silk, linen, and synthetics. Some hankies were embellished with lace, crochet, tatting, embroidery, or cutwork. Ladies often had two hankies – *one for show, and one to blow*. Besides for the nose, hankies have been used

for many purposes: a bandage, cleaning, polishing shoes, sweat band, neckerchief, head scarf, wardrobe decoration, dancing, romantic stures, and respiratory protection. In the UK hankies with tied corners are




gestures, and respiratory protection. In the UK hankies with tied corners are worn as sun hats at the beach. During the Civil War era a sugar cube for sucking was put in the head of a hankie doll to keep children quiet during church. A hankie passed down through generations might be made into a christening bonnet and repurposed years later to add to a wedding bouquet.





Hankies were used to portray political ideas, household instructions, travel destinations, etc. The Ministry of Health in England encouraged the use of handkerchiefs in the 1940s with a

The handkerchief era was greatly impacted by the invention of the Kleenex in the



1920s, which promoted a more healthy, disposable feature. *Little Golden Book* in the 1950s featured Little Lulu with things to make and do using Kleenex.

Artist and textile designer Tammis Keefe created over 400 whimsical hankie designs in the 1940s-50s. She was one of first to sign her name conspicuously on front of her work and her vintage designs are well sought after still today.

Historian Ann Mahony has a collection of over 5,000 vintage handkerchiefs with themes from nursery rhymes to golfing.

poster and film campaign - 'Coughs and sneezes spread diseases.'

Quilters are fond of upcycling vintage hankies as is or with transforming patterns such as butterflies, bonnet girls, dancers, baskets, and fans.
