President – Mary McCarthy.

- October Board meeting minutes were approved as published.
- Calico roses are to be awarded to Trixie Shell for the Fall Mini-retreat and to Sandra Doyle for the Houston Bus trip.
- December Board Meeting will held at Karen Nanos' house on Tuesday, December 4 at 5:00 pm.

President Pro-Tem – Dea Jae Shore.

- Nothing to report.

Treasurer – Karen Nanos. Several items were covered:

- Total Guild funds on hand at the end of October were \$62,584.98.
- Provided info on Auction income/expenses over recent years.
- Recommendations for future quilt auctions to ensure maximum benefit:
 - Quilts sold at auction should have a reserve
 - Include a lunch to offset the cost of the venue.
- Discussed proposed budget and updated.
- Made a motion that starting January 1, 2019 the guild will pass along the transaction fee to those members who pay by credit card; the motion was seconded, and the motion carried.
- The signers on guild CDs held by Security Service FCU will be changed from Ida Blankenship and Cindy Shutt to Mary McCarthy and Karen Nanos.
- Discussed need for an account to link to Etsy for sale of remaining auction quilts.

- Fall Mini-Retreat and Houston Bus Trip. Both activities were very successful, thanks to the work of Trixie Shell on the mini-retreat and Sandra Doyle on the bus trip.

- Winter Retreat. Melissa Allo, organizer. Retreat is full with a waiting list.
- Quilt Show, 2019. Janet Miller, chairperson. Raffle Quilt will be unveiled at the November Guild meeting.

12.18 Pieces of the Past, 104: **Keepsake Theme Quilts**, by Ellen Hernandez

Meredith Crane, mother of two Deaf children, started a unique business in 1998 in a Columbus, Ohio home with two people and one sewing machine. Their mission was to hire, train, and promote Deaf individuals in an environment free from communication barriers. Over 100 people have worked at the nonprofit Keepsake Theme Quilts (KTQ) through the years and have created more than

20,000 quilts. Items include custom designed t-shirt quilts, Memory quilts from items of clothing, Baby quilts using a child's clothes and blankets, and tied blankets. They also accept photos for digital fabric transfer.



Currently there are 15 employees and they make an average 1,000 quilts per year. They strive to make quality products so that customers will continue to seek out their work. Most quilts are finished in two to three weeks. Machine embroidery may be requested to personalize a quilt including the international 'I LOVE YOU' hand sign. Quilt prices and design options are available online. The office has a video phone so that the Deaf staff can respond to calls.



All the staff use American Sign Language and can easily communicate with their co-workers to solve problems and complete projects. Working in a hearing environment does not usually offer the same level of comfort, recognition, or advancement.

A Work Experience Program is run by Deaf high school student interns called the *Be Warm Project*. The students upcycle all sorts of materials into tote bags, hats, scarves, etc for the homeless in Ohio.



Other areas of KTQ work include donations to the James Cancer Hospital's quilting group, *My Very Own Blanket* – a project for the incarcerated, and *The Love Blanket Project of Maryland* which donates quilts to children in cancer treatment. In November the KTQ team joined inmates at The Ohio Reformatory for Women where they made blankets for the homeless.

**GSAQG General Meeting Minutes
Nov 17, 2018**

Mary McCarthy, President, called the meeting to order at 10:00 a.m. at the Coker UMC gym.

President – Mary McCarthy.

- The October General Meeting minutes were approved as published.
- There were no nominations from the floor for the 2019-2010 GSAQG Board. The ballot for new officers was:
 - President: Mary McCarthy
 - Secretary: Janice Schwab
 - 2nd VP for Information: Ina Ramirez
 - 5th VP for Community Outreach: Gail Clover
- Made a motion to accept the new board members, the motion was seconded, and the motion carried.
- The budget was amended since publication to add \$800 to auction, increase bright hopes to \$500, increase quilt angels \$400, and give ITC \$25. Motion was made to accept the amended budget, the motion was seconded, and the motion carried.
- Calico rosebuds were not awarded as neither recipient was at the meeting.
- The kitchen will NOT be used for the December Guild party, so only bring ready-to-serve items.
- No services will be held at the December meeting.
- Need someone to sell magazines at the meeting. Volunteers need to be able to bring the boxes of magazines to and from the meetings, and store them offsite.

President Pro-Tem – Dea Jae Shore.

- Nothing to report.

Secretary – Lyn Komada.

- Nothing to report.

Treasurer – Karen Nanos reported

- Guild cash and savings of \$62,548.88 at the end of November.
- The Guild netted about 9k from auction; numbers are still coming in so a final number is not available yet.
- The Guild has some activities which are self-sustaining and do not cost the Guild anything, such as the Houston bus trip and retreats. While these should not cost the Guild anything, they do because the Guild is charged to process credit card payments of members who pay via credit card. In order for activities to remain net zero to guild, the following charges will be implemented starting in January:
 - Credit card charge of \$1-50 will incur a \$1 fee.
 - Credit card charge over \$50 will incur a 2% fee.

1st VP for Special Events – Elaine Staller. Committees & activities reported:

- Houston bus trip and the Mini Retreat were successful.
- Sandra Doyle will organize the 2019 bus trip but needs new assistants to replace Lisetta Ennis and Sandra Lowell, who are stepping down.
- Board position of 1st VP for Special Events will be on the 2019 ballot. If you are interested, talk to Elaine and you can shadow her if you wish for the remainder of her term.
- Janet Miller reported on the 2019 GSAQG Quilt Show
 - It will be held Sept 20-21 at the San Antonio Event Center, with space for over 300 quilts.

- Consider making small items such as table runners, wall quilts, or pillows for the silent auction. Please use fabrics that have current appeal.
- Ida Blankenship has been finding vendors and sponsors. Sew Special will sponsor the \$500 Best of Show prize. Gromes will be a Silver Sponsor. Valley Ranch Retreat will be a Bronze Sponsor. An additional Silver Sponsor is needed, as well as three more Bronze Sponsors. Contact Ida if you know of any businesses who might want to be a vendor or a sponsor.
- Our 2019 Raffle quilt was debuted at the meeting. 22 members made blocks for the quilt, Janet did the machine appliqué, and Yvonne Maglinte did the quilting. The pattern, Delectable Stars, was free and found on Pinterest. It fits the show theme, Color the World with Quilts. Raffle tickets will be available starting in January.

- Dea Jae Shore reminded everyone that there are no services in December, so the January meeting is the next opportunity to renew your membership at a guild meeting. 4th VP for Services – Leti Zavala. Committees reported:

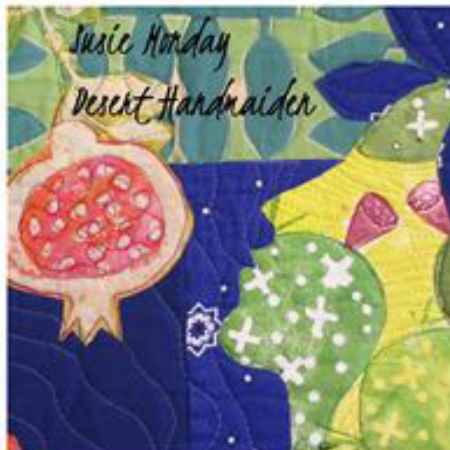
- Nancy Beasley explained how the Golden Carrot Drawing works. This month's Golden Carrot was won by Irene Moffett.

5th VP for Community Outreach – Barbara Sumlin. Committees reported:

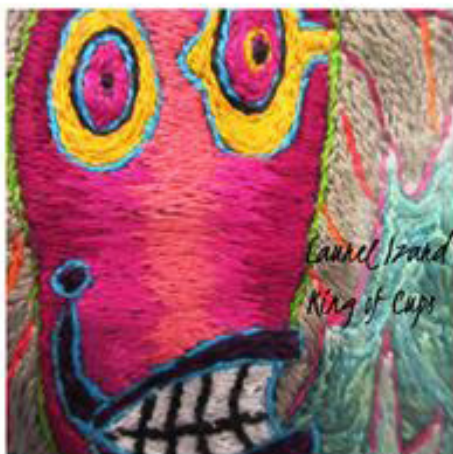
- Gail Clover will be taking it over next year. Have a helper but want one more.
