**President – Mary McCarthy**

1. Welcomed guest Jen Eskridge, Chairman of the 2021 Quilt Show. Jen presented her research regarding the 2021 show that requires board input. Considerations included a forever home venue, parking pricing, date change, corporation sponsorship search, grant application, and coordinating with other guilds for a regional show. Her research will continue.
2. Awarded a Calico Rose to Janet Miller for the 2019 Quilt Show.
3. September minutes were approved.
4. Discussed the 2020 guild meeting venue. A motion made by Gail Clover and seconded by Elaine Staller to move the venue to Covenant Presbyterian Church was passed.
5. Reminder to those giving up their board positions to Pass On to new board members before December meeting/dinner.

**President Pro Tem - Dea Jae Shore**

1. A motion made by Dea Jae and seconded by Karen Nanos to increase the 2021 dues by \$3 was passed. At that time the credit card fees will be eliminated for dues only.
2. A motion made by Dea Jae and seconded by Ina Ramirez was passed to dispense with the Safe Site Storage and move the permanent collection to the regular storage by the end of December.

**Secretary - Janice Schwab**

1. Reported that the Covenant Church will allow guild sales.

**Treasurer - Karen Nanos**

1. Reported the current total balance is \$74,415.89.
2. Submitted a proposed budget for 2020 to reflect increased expenses for new venue, newsletter, storage facility and decreases in other areas. Proposal will be published in the newsletter.

**1<sup>st</sup> VP for Special Events – Elaine Staller**

1. Winter Retreat, January 27, 2020 Organizer Melissa Allo will continue sign-ups at the October meeting. Information is on the website as well as in the newsletter. No report on current number of sign-ups. Melissa is checking with the venue on the feasibility of holding the retreat with 30 attendees. Retreat is open to non-members ONLY if they purchase a guild membership along with the retreat fee.
2. Houston Bus Trip, November 2, 2019 Organizer Sandra Doyle reports 11 seats are open. Flyers were posted at the Quilt Show and in local shops. Non-members are welcome.
3. Fall Mini-Retreat, October 25-26, 2019 Co-organizer Janice Frankenburger reports that the mini-retreat is full and she is taking names for a waiting list.

11.19 Pieces of the Past, 115: **Sewing Oddities**, by Ellen Hernandez

What is it, what is it for, and how does it relate to sewing? It's an ear pick, most commonly made of silver, used in medieval times. The spoon-shaped end was used to remove earwax that was often saved and used for coating sewing thread to make it stronger and easier to use. (The pointed end was used as a toothpick.) Linen thread easily frayed, kinked, and weakened while sewing and a coating of wax strengthened it. Eventually beeswax became the preferred product for the job.



The French expression 'to sit cross-legged' is *s'asseoir en tailleur* or literally "sitting in tailor's pose." This phrase, still used today, comes from the common practice of two male tailors sitting cross-legged on a work table near good lighting while hand sewing one garment at the same time. Tailors continued this cross-legged table sitting even into the 1940s.



Lucets were made from antlers and animal bones. The two-pronged tool was used to finger braid a length of thread used to lace up a vest or bodice, or attach items to a belt. They date to possibly the 7th century, and were most popular in the 12th century.

In the Victorian era, Queen Elizabeth popularized wearing mourning attire and jewelry for extended periods after the loss of a loved one. In her case, she had lost her beloved Albert. Widows were not to wear any bright or flashy items. They used specially made black *Mourning Pins* to secure closure of their clothing and to hold veils. The pins were also used to secure black crepe mourning material. Germany was the primary manufacturer of Mourning Pins.



In World War I, Hope Elizabeth Hope-Clarke of Wimbledon started the *Silver Thimble Fund* which collected broken thimbles and other metal trinkets. The items were melted down and the profits went to purchase medical equipment for the war, including enough for five launches, fifteen ambulances, and mobile xray and dental surgery units. After the War, Hope-Clarke moved to the US and helped start the similar *Silver Thimble Fund of America* in New Orleans, which aided World War II British and American soldiers.



In the mid-1800s photographer Rene Dagron was able to mass produce miniature slides and lenses based on the previous work of inventors Stanhope and John Dancer. Portraits, landscapes, landmarks, and advertisements were small enough to fit on the head of a pin and easily be visualized through the magnifying lenses. These "Stanhopes" were put in many objects such as thimbles, needle cases, pens, letter openers, pocket knives, scissors, watch keys, and jewelry charms. Risque photographs were often installed in items used primarily by men, such as smoking equipment. It is estimated that 80 million Stanhopes were made, and many of the tiny surviving photographs/lenses are undetected by their current owners. Interestingly, Dagron helped develop an espionage system attaching microphotographed messages on carrier pigeons during the Siege of Paris in 1870.

1. Since Elaine will miss the November meeting, this is her last meeting as 1<sup>st</sup> VP. She expressed her appreciation to her committees for their hard work and success during her tenure.
2. Quilt Show 2019 – Chairman Janet Miller
  - a. Karen Nanos reported that the 2019 show netted \$28,500 an increase of \$11,550 from the 2017 show.
  - b. Thank yous were issued to all contributors who donated quilts and monetary gifts to the Quilt Show which helped make it a huge success.
  - c. A search is being conducted to find The Ethel Howey Basket Quilt which disappeared from the show. Guild members offered many suggestions to assist in the search.
3. Fall Mini-Retreat, October 25-26, 2019 - Co-organizer Janice Frankenburger reports that the mini-retreat is full and she is taking names for a waiting list.
4. Houston Bus Trip, November 2, 2019 - Organizer Sandra Doyle reports that the bus quota is met but there are still seats available. The bus leaves St. Francis Church at 6:30 a.m. and leaves Houston at 6:30 p.m. Breakfast tacos and Jason's Deli dinner supplied. The church asks that participants park in the outer spaces of the lot.

6. 2020 Auction chair Jean Hardies and QPFC chair Ida Blankenship reported that 24 quilts are finished and ready for auction. Last year at this time there was 1 quilt completed.
7. QPFC meets on the 4<sup>th</sup> Thursday of each month.
