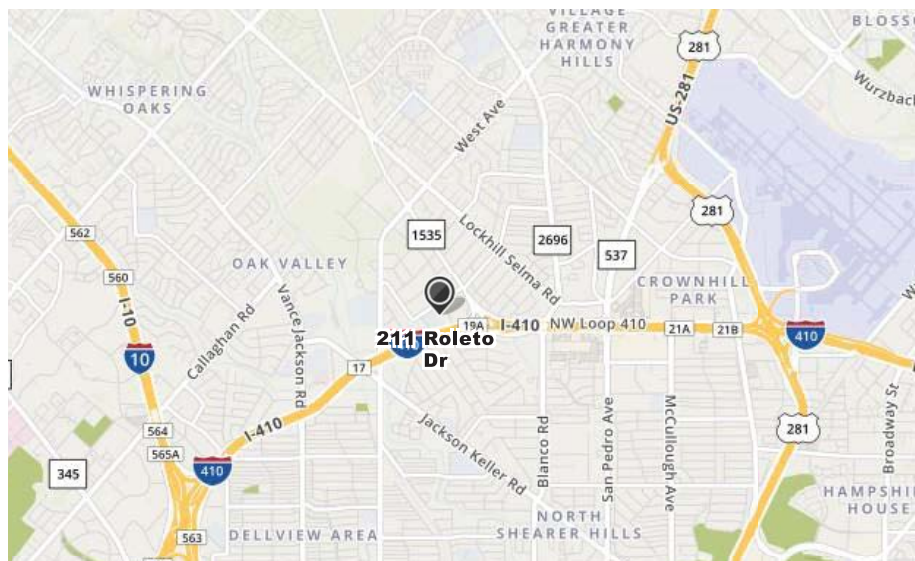

2.20 Pieces of the Past, 118: Laura Ashley, by Ellen Hernandez



Laura Mountney was born in Wales and lived in England until World War II started. Then she was evacuated to Wales and at age 16 served three years in the Women’s Royal Naval Service. She had learned to quilt from her grandmother and continued to be interested in quilting for years, especially small Victorian fabric designs. After viewing



vintage patchwork quilts at the Victoria and Albert Museum in London in 1953 with her husband Bernard Ashley, Laura decided to screen print her own fabric patterns on linen. Her ‘pop art’ and geometric designs were created in the kitchen with Bernard’s printing machine and made into scarves, napkins, and tea towels which were immediately desirable.



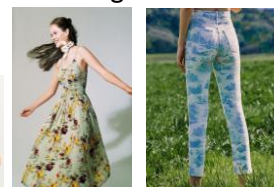
In 1960 the family moved to Wales and Laura designed clothing reminiscent of the Victorian era. They were instantly popular during “the flower child era” in the late 1960s. She soon opened shops in England, Australia, Canada, Japan, Paris, and the US. Laura had a line of pre-packaged *Patchwork Pieces*. Home furnishings were also featured in her 70 stores. Daughter,



Jane, was the company’s photographer. Two perfumes were introduced. Her iconic flowing, flowery, prairie style fashions were in high demand. Soon to be “Princess” Diana was famously photographed in a Laura Ashley (see-through) skirt.



After Ashley’s sudden death at age 60 in 1985 as the result of a fall down stairs, her husband, Sir Bernard, continued to run the business for several years, adding a wallpaper plant and increasing to 450 stores. The company was bought out in 1999 by MUI Asia Limited and continues to sell Laura Ashley products in stores, by catalog, and online. As of 2013 there were 250 Laura Ashley stores worldwide, but forty closed in 2018. In partnership with Urban Outfitters in 2018/19, a whole line of Laura Ashley products is available, from flowing dresses to bathing suits, bedding, china, and removable wallpaper. Many current designers and companies are copying the Ashley dress design features, such as *Batsheva* Hay, Margaret and Katherine Kleveland of *Doen*, *The Vampire’s Wife*, and *Ulla Johnson*.



In 2013 The Bath Fashion Museum exhibited ‘*Laura Ashley: The Romantic Heroine Exhibition*’ which celebrated Victoriana inspired dresses, from cotton twill shifts to halter sundresses. Vintage dresses remain collectors’ items.

The Laura Ashley archives are in London and Wales. There, thousands of items are cataloged, studied, and maintained. Many have been donated by loyal Ashley customers, such as a cornflower blue dress worn by a bride in 1974. Also in the collection are some of Laura’s fabric and quilt ephemera.



New ventures include boutique hotels, *The Manor in Elstree*, and *The Belsfield on Lake Windermere*, designed using Laura



Ashley Home collections. In 2017 the first of ten *Laura Ashley Tea Rooms* opened.

2. Membership dues will be accepted today. The deadline to renew is February. Members who have not renewed by then will not be listed in the 2020 directory.

Secretary - Janice Schwab ~ Nothing to report.**Treasurer** – Cindy Shutt

1. Reported the current total balance is \$73,182.47.

1st VP for Special Events – Sandy Doyle

1. Winter retreat, January 24-27 – Organizer Melissa Allo, has openings. Check in begins at 10:00. Further instructions will be e-mailed to participants.
2. Spring mini retreat, St Francis Episcopal Church – Organizer Trixie Shell. Sign-ups will begin at the February meeting.
3. Summer retreat, June 14-19. Sign-up may include yourself and one other. A \$50 deposit is required; retreat cost is \$400.
4. Auction, September 19, at Leon Valley Community Center - Organizer Jean Hardies showed an example of an auction quilt. She reported there are 27 entries so far.
5. Quilt Show, 2021 – Chair Jen Eskridge requested volunteers to fill co-chair, publicity, and 40th anniversary quilt (legacy quilt) positions.

2nd VP for Information – Ina Ramirez

1. Reviewed location of new facility, Covenant Presbyterian Church. Reminded members to park in the back lot of the church for easy access to the gym.

Most of us remember the serious business of naming our children. Finding a name that evokes the right mood or sends the right message is important. When Julia Roberts named the twins Phineas and Hazel, I thought she was a little off the mark. I think Gwyneth Paltrow missed by a mile with “Apple” and “Moses” and I have to believe that the magician who named his child “Moxie Crimefighter” was in some kind of drug induced stupor at the time. Yet I continue to be fascinated by the monikers we hang on things.

Some of us choose to name our vehicles. It’s a form of personification that I find endearing. “Cottonball”, “Pearl”, “Big Blue” . . . those names personalize inanimate objects and give them distinct personalities. Naming something gives it importance.

I like to name my quilts. From the moment of their conception, I begin to run names through my head. Maybe by invoking the right name, I can coax that quilt’s latent personality to the forefront for all to see. It’s a mental game that I love to play.

Sometimes I try to pull my quilting friends into the fun by inviting them to help me choose an applicable appellation. In fact, we’ve spent a couple of guild retreats naming my quilts. Some of the suggestions can be downright hilarious. I’ve got a log cabin quilt top (my first attempt at quilting) dubbed “DW Squared”. It sounds fairly normal but it stands for “D.W.D.W.” which is short for “Dog With a Death Wish”. We’ll leave the exact circumstances of that quilt name for another time.

My point is this . . . when you’re leafing through those magazines or viewing quilts at a show, give some heed to the names their creators have bestowed upon them. Was time and effort put into this name? Is it creative, evocative, or symbolic? Not only will you learn something about the quilt, but there’s a good chance you will come to know something about the creator as well. You may just start to see those quilts in surprising, eye-widening, horizon broadening ways. See you second Saturday!

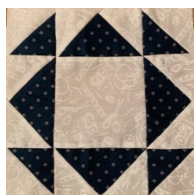
From the Quilts Project Committee (QPC)...

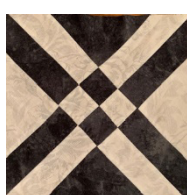
Applique not your thing? No problem! We have 5 different blocks to offer.
