5.2020 Pieces of the Past, 121: Liberation Skirts, by Ellen Hernandez



*Bevrijdingsrok* (liberation skirt) *or levensrok* (skirt of life) were made popular in The Netherlands after WWII by Mies Boissevain-Van Lennep (1896-1965.) She had been in a concentration camp for her involvement with the Dutch Resistance rescuing Jewish children. While interned, she received a smuggled patchwork scarf made from the clothing of relatives, including her own children, and friends. The colorful patches brought a bit of joy to her fellow inmates, but the scarf was later confiscated.

The War deeply affected Mies as her husband died in a concentration camp and her two sons and a nephew were executed. After the War, Mies helped form the *Dutch Women's* 



*Movement* and set out to celebrate the rebuilding of their homeland. As a means of healing and comfort, she transformed the scarf patchwork recycling idea into skirts. Her mottos were 'new from old', 'building from the broken', 'one garment makes unity' and 'unity in diversity.' The patched skirts were to follow strict rules: be





made of pieces of old clothing sewn onto an old skirt and the bottom was to have solid colored equal triangles with the date 5 May 1945, the day of Liberation, or other national holiday dates sewn in. Some skirts included orange fabric to honor the Dutch House of Orange - the royal

family of Queen Wilhelmina and Princess Juliana. Over 4,000 liberation skirts were officially registered with



Mies' group.

In September 1948 hundreds of women wore the skirts in an Amsterdam parade celebrating the Golden Jubilee of Queen Wilhelmina. The "National Skirt" song was composed to honor the idea of the skirts, 'Weave into your skirt your own life's design...may present and past, both cheerfully worn, fill family, skirt, and your life with their grace.'

Mies went on a US speaking tour in 1949, visiting 27 states.



She promoted the idea of *Magic Skirts of Reconstruction* as an international symbol for female values. Mies compared the bright colors of the skirts to vitamins for the Liberation group, calling them a 'life necessity.'

These skirts continued to be worn annually into the 1980s on Liberation Day. Today several Liberation Skirts are in museum collections. Some skirts are still being found in antique shops.






