

#### Dear Guild Members.

As Chairwoman of the Bright Hopes Committee, I am excited to inform the Guild Board and its members that we have received quite an unexpected honor.

On Tuesday October 6th, we were told by Gail Rebalta (Chief Development and Administrative Officer of RMYA) that RYMA has nominated the Bright Hopes Committee to receive United Way's Volunteer Award of 2020. We have filmed our informational video that will be sent to United Way. The nomination paper asks that a nominee be an individual or individualls "whose volunteer efforts have made a significant impact during the Covid-19 crisis. The effort should be above and beyond commitment to your organization."

Our continuing donations of 10 quilt and 10 tote bags every month plus our sewing over 300 masks when needed apparently has made quite a positive difference to Roy Maas Youth Alternatives. THANK YOU to each and every one of our fellow quilters who have helped us with donations of guilts and bags. THANK YOU to those who have helped us by finishing quilts for us each month. Our need is ongoing and we look forward to continue to help an organization determined to help children who often desperately need that help.

For those who don't have much information about RMYA here is some. This group has 2 different sites. Meadowland in Boerne can help children from age 5 to 18 for as long as 3 years. The West Avenue campus is much more volatile. Some children are there for as little as 2 days. RYMA has also obtained 6 homes neighboring its West Ave. site. These have been obtained through purchase and gifts. These homes are used for young people ages 18 to 24 who have aged out of the foster care system. These people have no place to go, but still need guidance. Every child is able to attend their charter school and is taught life skills that will guide them to a successful adulthood. Life shills can be totally foreign to a child on the streets. Our quilts are given to children in all of these areas. When the 6<sup>th</sup> home for the older kids was recently opened, the young adults moved into their bedrooms and each had one of our 4th of July / independence day quilts on the bed. These young people were thrilled.

Rov Maas Youth Alternatives has also been one of the first in the nation to develop a specific program for children rescued from sex trafficking. Its director, Chuck Paul, was recently named the "2020 National Safe Place Coordinator of the Year". A safe place, like RMYA, is for children under the age of 18 who need immediate help.

We in Bright Hopes are especially thrilled to be able to continue to support RMYA, its staff, and its children. Many facilities who help needy children like the big Whataburger House have had to close because of Covid.

We are so grateful for the support of the Guild members. Your giving of themed quilts such as Christmas, Valentine's Day, Spring time, and Fourth of July is greatly appreciated. Your quilts and bags added to the ones we make. We appreciate any quilt or bag you give us. We have material and kits for quilting or piecing. We also have kits for making bags.


#### **Class for November -**

#### 11.2020 Pieces of the Past, 127: Bessie Jackson, by Ellen Hernandez

Bessie Jackson left Lorneville, Nova Scotia, Canada and moved to Boston, eventually marrying James Burne in 1925. A few years after her marriage twenty-one women from Bessie's hometown each made a quilt square embroidered with their name as a wedding gift. Raising seven children interrupted Bessie's completion of the quilt and after her death in 1977 the squares were passed to her sister in Guysborough and then later to her niece, Hope Wright.



Hope decided to present the squares to the quilt group of the Lorneville United Church for completion. Surprisingly many of the names on the squares were of relatives of the volunteers – aunts, mothers, grandmothers, and great-grandmothers. The project was pieced and hand quilted over the winter, each block chosen by a relative of the signer. The quilt won first prize in the 2012 Cumberland County Exhibition in Oxford, and a Special Prize for uniqueness. The quilt is now displayed in the Lorneville United Church with a plaque commemorating the sisterhood of these *travelling quilt blocks*, over eighty years in the making.







Friendship Autograph quilts were more informal and were usually made with just one block as opposed to the more formal Sampler Album quilt. It was not uncommon to use clothing scraps for a Friendship quilt as only one block was required from each contributor. Many quilt block patterns were adapted for signatures. In the 1800s the signature might have been done with new indelible inks. During the Depression the names were often embroidered.
