12.2020 Pieces of the Past, 128: Frieda Warther Button House, by Ellen Hernandez



The home of Frieda Warther in Dover, Ohio is most unique, decorated with over 100,000 buttons of pearl, ceramic, rubber, and metal. Born in Switzerland, at age four Frieda moved with her family to Ohio. As a cultural tradition, the gift of a mother's button box was given to the oldest daughter, that being Frieda. She was fascinated with the buttons and made jewelry with them. She went on to collect all sorts of buttons during her lifetime and at age 60 she mounted the buttons onto boards with wire or dental floss. Her patterns mimicked traditional quilt blocks though many are original designs. The walls and ceilings of her home are covered with these boards.









Frieda married Ernest Mooney Warther, a World Master Carver. He opened a museum in 1936 in their backyard. As an admirer of trains, most of his 64 ebony, ivory, and walnut carvings are scaled reproduction steam trains. Mooney's first date with Frieda was to go on an arrowhead search. They continued this Sunday habit for years, collecting over 5,000 arrowheads. Frieda mounted them also into patterns throughout their home.

Frieda founded Dover's Garden Club, led in 4-H and taught many women to sew, make wreaths, press flowers, and can vegetables. Her garden was Swiss designed and even today her original flowers continue to seed.

The Ernest Warther Museum & Gardens continues to attract many tourists. The eight-acre grounds and gardens are beautifully manicured and they have held many special dinners, weddings, and Spring and Christmas events. The museum and park are now operated by Frieda's children and grandchildren with a mission to "share, educate, and delight visitors" with the art work of two unique artists.
