7.2021 Pieces of the Past, 135: The Red Dress Embroidery Project, by Ellen Hernandez



British artist Kirstie Macleod began a sewing project in 2009 for Art Dubai that has taken an eleven-year journey around the world to be completed. A magnificent ruby red silk dress was created with embroideries by 200 women and two men from 28 countries – Kosovo, Rwanda, Congo, Palestine, Peru, Bombay, Columbia, Bedouins in Egypt, and more. The embroideries reflect various cultures and traditional styles. Many of the women live in poverty. Some are refugees and survivors of civil war. All the commissioned artisans were paid for their work. Over 80 contributors were volunteers.

Macleod grew up in many countries and was interested in cultures and textiles early on. The history of the Silk Trade routes influenced her choice of fabric for the dress. She traveled with the dress to a few countries as it was worked on, but often a patch was completed by

artisans and sent to her. Volunteers helped attach these many patches onto the dress. In some locations Macleod unusually displayed the gown embroidering it while wearing it, sitting inside an acrylic cube. The original dress design had a high, conservative collar and neckline in fitting with modest cultures. The final version has a lower neckline and weighs 45 pounds. The unique, empowering dress has been displayed in galleries around the world. It won first prize in 2015 at the Premio Valcellina Textiles in Maniago, Italy. The UK has been filming a documentary, which will be released in 2022, to share the stories of the artisans. And the stories and hand crafts are phenomenal. A book is also in progress. #### **Attention Quilters**

This is your opportunity to test your creative brains, have a little fun, and support your guild!

Because of the pandemic, we are changing the quilt fabric challenge up a bit. As mentioned in previous guild meetings—anything goes! All submissions will be happily received and appreciated. Thank you for your support and for helping your guild make lemonade out of lemons.

#### **Parameters**

- The challenge fabric must be recognizable in the entered project.
- The project can be created and finished by more than one person.
- If you use a pattern, please credit your source.
- You may submit as many entries as you would like however, there will be only one prize awarded per person and per project.
- The submission will be a digital submission this year. You need to submit three pictures of your project.
  - One of the three pictures should include the entire project.
  - A second picture should highlight the challenge fabric in your project.
  - The third picture should be your choice between showing your project from a different viewpoint or close-up view of the detail.

#### **Entering**

Opportunity to link submissions is open !!!! The absolute deadline to submit for prize consideration ends on July 31<sup>st</sup>. Any quilted project submission received after July 31st may be included in the slideshow but will not be considered for a prize. #### **Awards**

The awards are intentionally broad in order to give the best opportunity for all types of quilting submissions. Each type of award will have a unique winner, even though a quilt project may fit into more than one award area.

- Most creative use of challenge fabric/originality
- Most unique project design/overall appearance
- Best use of color/harmonizing with the challenge fabric
- Surprise award (had to throw in a little mystery)

#### **Judging**

The judging committee will not be given names of the quilters and will judge individually and then decide as a group on the prize winners.


#### **Reveal & Prizes**


All the submissions will be presented by PowerPoint at the August guild meeting, where the award winners will be revealed.

# The Storybook Quilt Paleta Challenge!

- Join us in making a group quilt to accompany the book What Can You Do With a Paleta?
- Create an 8.5 inch (unfinished) block.
- Use a bright solid color or tone on tone for the background - think FIESTA!
- Leave at least half an inch border around the edge of the block.
- Applique a cool and delicious paleta onto the background using the templates provided.
- Don't hesitate to be creative. Take a bite out of the paleta or add juicy drip near the bottom.
- Use your choice of applique technique but be sure to secure the paleta so the finished quilt can withstand laundering.

- 1. Quilt Distribution. The committee delivers quilt kits to schools, libraries and childcare centers two or three time a year. This task requires a visit to the storage space to pick up kits then a drive to several schools for delivery and later retrieval.
- Evaluation and Weeding. To make sure the best examples of the quilting art and the finest
  quality of children's literature are included in our kits, an inventory and evaluation is about to
  commence. Volunteering for this subcommittee will require several in person meetings as we
  work our way through the kit collection.
- Paleta Quilt Challenge. Hopefully many Guild members are currently making Paleta Blocks to contribute to this group effort. Additional help will be needed to assemble and complete the quilt. This effort will require some in person coordination as well as independent sewing at home.
