### **UPDATES** for Programs

August -- See the quilts entered into the Challenge fabric contest. In addition, we're previewing the jellyroll quilt patterns you could be using at our September meeting. Why? So that you can get your jellyrolls ready and get any extra fabric needed cut and ready to go.

**September** -- Jelly Roll Celebration! Our FIRST online SEW IN. September in the quilt world is jellyroll month. (Who decides these things?) Use your jellyrolls and show off your blocks as you make them! Use this opportunity to make blocks to give away or to make tops for future gifts. (Side note: I decided to cut all of my leftover Christmas fabric into 2 1/2" strips, since none of them coordinated. I am using them to try out some of these jellyroll patterns. I was surprised to see how many strips they made. So far - One pattern down, another to try. My trouble is that a friend then gave her remaining Christmas fabric, so now I will have MORE strips and a third pattern to try.)

If you have fabrics left over from your projects, consider cutting them into 2 1/2" strips so that 1) you can use them up, 2) you can join the fun sewing a newto-you pattern and 3) you can feel good about yourself if you then donate the blocks. The relief from the stress - Out of Your House! Remember that great quilts can have all sorts of fabric styles and colors.

October -- Our last speaker for the year: Nancy Roelfsema. She is teaching Lone Star on Friday, and Wonky Rails on Saturday. Please check out her website OnPoint TV. She has a series of FREE you tube videos. Included in that list is a set of 14 videos about the Lone Star. This is the first time since March 2020 that we will have a Friday class!

**November** -- Show off your favorite fall-themed quilts in our program. No Chat and Sew planned. Get those last minute Christmas gifts made!

7.2021 Pieces of the Past, 136: Bisa Butler, by Ellen Hernandez



In the 1990s Bisa Butler was a Fine Arts student planning to have a career as a painter and an art educator. She developed an aversion to the challenges of painting, especially using chemicals, after the birth of her daughter. As a sewer, who learned from her mother and grandmother, she liked the idea of layering fabrics and turned to them instead for her palette in creating portraits. Using hundreds of pieces of fabrics, her vibrant quilted pieces have become recognizable and have been featured in many galleries.

Butler begins her quilts with an in-depth study of vintage black and white photographs. She focuses on images of Black subjects and when she is done, the figures come alive with unexpected vibrant coloring. Her works are referred to as 'Kool-Aid colors.' Natural skin tones are never used. After enlarging the photo to life size, she determines light and dark areas and begins to applique, using fabrics from all over the world such as velvet, wool, silk, chiffon, and wax-cast African cotton prints. She quilts the life size layered portraits using a long-arm.










Portraits of young Black boys are especially important to Butler to relay to the non-Black world that each "person is human, he has a soul, he has wants and dreams and wishes" rather than evoking nervousness.



Butler's quilted portrait of Wangar Maathai, the first African woman to win the Nobel Peace Prize, was chosen as a *Time* magazine cover in 2020. "To God and Truth" is a ten by twelve-foot quilt of the 1899 Morris Brown College baseball team. It is now in the permanent collection of the Museum of Fine Arts, Boston. This year Butler has had an exhibit of 20 quilts at the Art Institute of Chicago. Her book, *Bisa Butler:*

Artwork Standards: All pieces must be original, handmade and signed by the artist. Only work from artists listed on the application are permitted. No mass produced work will be permitted. Work created with pre-printed fabrics, kits and patterns will not be permitted. No sale or discount signage permitted. Permitted reproductions include silk screen, lithography, intaglio, and other hand pulled prints, and signed giclee prints.

Artist Amenities: Booth sitters will be available for up to 15 minutes at a time. Free water through out the event and access to the hospitality table for exhibitors. Indoor restrooms available to exhibitors and patrons. Flat affordable booth fee, no commission.

Booth Space: Booths are located outside in the side parking lot. Each exhibitor will have one 10x10 space. Exhibitors must provide their own tents, tent weights, tables, chairs and display equipment. All materials must be kept within the assigned booth area and cannot extend into the neighboring booths. Exhibitors will be permitted to unload in the side parking lot, but must move their vehicle to the far side of the parking lot before 9:45 a.m. No vehicles on the lawn. Exhibitors may begin setting up at 8 a.m. No electricity provided.

### **Exhibitor Agreement**

- \* All displayed work shall be made by the artist or members of an art non-profit organization.
- \* Artwork must be comparable to submitted images or exhibitor will be asked to remove those items.
- \* The artist must staff their own booths, no representatives.
- \* Exhibitor authorizes the City of San Antonio Parks and Recreation Department and the Lions Field Association to use Exhibitor's images provided in the Exhibitor's application for promotion of past and future events only with no compensation.
- \* Exhibitor agrees to remain present and maintain an open exhibition space during event hours and understands that early departure is not allowed.
- \* Exhibitor is responsible for providing a cash box/change fund, if necessary.
- \* Exhibitor certifies that its sales will be in full compliance with the Texas Law regarding the collection of sales tax.
- \* No rain dates or refunds will be offered due to inclement weather. In the event of Inclement weather, the event will be moved indoors into the Lions Field Center.
- \* Exhibitor understand that no insurance is offered or provided to cover injury to Exhibitor or for damage to Exhibitor's property. Exhibitor is solely responsible for obtaining insurance coverage and shall be liable for damage caused by Exhibitor's property.
- \* Social Media will be used to promote this event. We appreciate your helping by also promoting on your social media accounts.
