# President's Letter


So now it's December 2021 – my! What a time we have had these past two years trying to keep our fellowship alive.

### **New Project for Guild Members**

Introducing a new project for guild members to participate. Carolina Chain by Bonnie Hunter is the name of the quilt pattern. Except, because I am not fond of small size blocks, I'm changing the size of the strips to 2 1/2" and the size of the blocks to 6 1/2" unfinished.

So, I'm targeting those strips and pieces leftover from our Jelly Roll Celebration in September. These blocks only use TWO fabrics for each block. They need to be high contrast and small scale prints. For the main color you need 14 inches of fabric. For the contrasting chain pieces you need 7 1/2" of fabric. The revised version of these blocks are on the website and in this newsletter.

These blocks will be used to make a queen size quilt for the auction in September 2022. You can give your blocks to any of the finishing committee members — Ida Kujowski, Jean Hardies, Jeanette Jay, DeaJae Shore, Suellis Moore, Cindy Shutt, or me. We'll arrange to me you at one of the local quilt shops.

We need 72 of the dark blocks and 72 of the light blocks to make the top. Get your machine humming and use up those 2 1/2" strips!



### 12.2021 Pieces of the Past, 140: Artistic Weaving Company, by Ellen Hernandez

The Kluge Brothers operated a narrow fabrics weaving mill in Krefeld, Germany in 1860. The artfully created labels were primarily for clothing and made of rayon and cotton, sometimes silk. By the 1880s the brothers left Germany to expand their business, one to Sweden, one to Italy, one to Russia and one to the US. Adolf Kluge began his company in New York City as the German Artistic Weaving Company. 'German' was later deleted due to world political situations. Adolf expanded to Pompton Lakes, New Jersey to use water-driven turbines. He had over 100 looms and his business was quite prosperous. Adolf died in 1920 and the company went to his son, Albert. Albert built a label mill in Pittsboro, NC which was later operated by his son, Willard, until the 1990's. After being sold to a NC label company, the business went bankrupt within two years.

Willard's son, Chris Kluge, owned old company label sample books from the 1920s-1930s. Family friend, Laura Hobson, used the labels to make this quilt in the 1970s. For years the quilt was displayed in the lobby of Lark Books in Asheville, NC. After Hobson's death, the quilt was given to Chris Kluge.







Artistic Weaving also created beautifully woven Christmas greetings. Albert Kluge's signature was included on many of the cards which were sent to his customers and friends. A very large quilt made with these vintage woven cards was discovered in Istanbul, Turkey in 2015. It is thought that the quilt was included with a care package sent to Afghanistan and later sold in a market.

### **COMMUNITY OUTREACH**

On Friday, November 12, GSAQG members Frances Contreras, Mary Harker and Viki Ash visited with sixty tenth graders from the Advanced Learning Academy (SAISD) during their field trip to Mission Estrada. The students were beginning a multi-disciplinary unit on storytelling through the lens of San Antonio's missions. Geometry teacher Payton Ayala invited the Guild to provide a brief presentation on quilt-making and to assist the students as they created a simple hand-stitched piecing project. For many of the students, it was the first time threading a needle, let alone trying to sew a straight seam. Ultimately, Ms. Payton hopes to create a quilt that tells the story of the mission experience using blocks designed and stitched by her students. Given the number of students who enthusiastically engaged in the sewing project while sitting under the trees at the mission, guild members left with a positive and optimistic outlook for the student quilt.
