New Project for Guild Members

Introducing a new project for guild members to participate. Carolina Chain by Bonnie Hunter is the name of the quilt pattern. Except, because I am not fond of small size blocks, I'm changing the size of the strips to 2 1/2" and the size of the blocks to 6 1/2" unfinished.

So, I'm targeting those strips and pieces leftover from our Jelly Roll Celebration in September. These blocks only use TWO fabrics for each block. They need to be high contrast and small scale prints. For the main color you need 14 inches of fabric. For the contrasting chain pieces you need 7 1/2" of fabric. The revised version of these blocks are on the website and in this newsletter.

These blocks will be used to make a queen size quilt for the auction in September 2022. You can give your blocks to any of the finishing committee members — Ida Kujowski, Jean Hardies, Jeanette Jay, DeaJae Shore, Suellis Moore, Cindy Shutt, or me. We'll arrange to me you at one of the local quilt shops.

We need 72 of the dark blocks and 72 of the light blocks to make the top. Get your machine humming and use up those 2 1/2" strips!



1.2022 Pieces of the Past, 141: Lord Raglan, by Ellen Hernandez



Lord Raglan (FitzRoy Somerset), Commander of British troops in the Crimean War, died of cholera in 1855 at age 65. Poet Tennyson recalled Raglan's critical actions in "Charge of the Light Brigade," an event which resulted in the death and injury of 245 of his men out of 670 soldiers. Raglan had a most interesting benevolent relationship with a young British nurse, Florence Nightingale, who made an impressive impact on battle line emergent care. She was deeply disturbed by Raglan's death which she attributed to strain and exhaustion. His replacement, GEN Simpson, was an ineffective leader and opposed much of Nightingale's work.

Lord Raglan lost his right arm in the Battle of Waterloo. In learning to live with his disability, he and his tailor designed the

raglan sleeve with a loose diagonal slant in 1815 specifically to provide more freedom of movement to dress, and for sword fighting. The raglan was chosen for the construction of the first WWI trench coats. The raglan remains a popular style, especially for two-color baseball jerseys.

In the Raglan estate sale in 2016 two quilts were put up for auction. One quilt was said to have been made by injured soldiers using some uniform fabrics, and was used by Raglan on his death bed. Even though damaged,
