
3.2022 Pieces of the Past, 143: Beetle Embroidery, by Ellen Hernandez



The Buprestidae or jewel beetle wings have a range of iridescent colors and have been used to adorn jewelry and textiles since the 1500s. The *Sternocera aequisignata* beetle is emerald green. Common in the forests of India, South America and Asia with a lifespan of three to four



weeks, the jewel beetle's elytra, or forewing, is about one-half to one inch long. The naturally shed elytra were used whole or cut into shapes and embroidered to fabric much like a sequin. Metallic threads were often





Shakespearean actress Ellen Terry wore a beetle adorned dress as Lady Macbeth at the

Lyceum Theatre in London in December 1888. The dress, and the play, were a sensation. The hand crocheted and knitted dress of green silk

included 1,000 wings embroidered with gold thread. Later displayed at the Ellen Terry Memorial Museum for years, the dress was donated to the National Trust in 1939. Curators collected beetle wings that had fallen off and they were repaired and reattached as part of a five year conservation project costing £110,000.



The dress was finally shown in Kent in 2011.



Artist John Singer Sargent was enthralled with Terry's appearance in the dress and painted her in 1889. The painting is now in the Tate Britain. Terry's iconic dress continues to be an inspiration as recently as in the movie *Brave*.

Lady Mary Curzon, Vicereine of India, wore an elaborate peacock gown created with

gold and silver threads and green beetle elytra to the 1903 Coronation Ball in Delhi. (Mary was the daughter of Levi Leiter, cofounder of Marshall Field.) The embroidery was done in panels by professionals in India and sent to the House of Worth in Paris to



be completed. The gown is owned by the National Trust.

Elytra fashion is becoming popular again, from the runway to the jewelry counter. Kate Blanchett in *Queen Elizabeth* in 2007, Charlize Theron in 2012's *Snow White and the Hunstman*, and Liv Tyler in 2019 *Harlots* all wore elytra adorned gowns. Currently Amazon offers 100 pre-drilled elytra from Thailand for \$17.
