

Summer clothing tip: UPF (Ultraviolet Protection Factor) measures the amount of ultraviolet protection - UVA and UVB - in fabric. Fifty is the highest protection allowing only $1/50^{th}$ of the rays to penetrate fabric. Many activewear shirts and swimwear are UPF rated, and those above 15 are good, compared to a regular t-shirt that has a UPF of only 1-4. UPF rated fabrics are usually more tightly woven and made of synthetics. The first FDA approval for sun protective clothing was in 1992 as a medical device.
