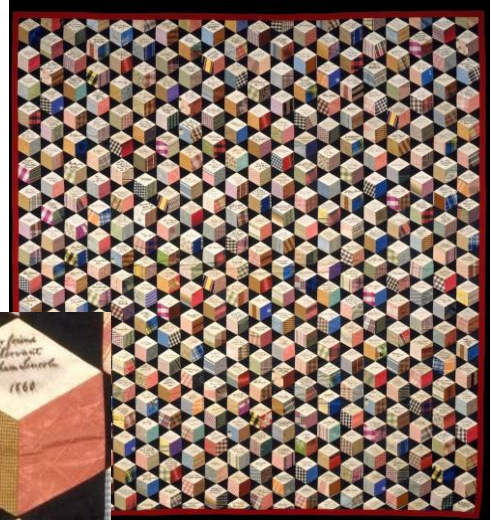
9.2022 Pieces of the Past, 149. **Celebrity Autograph Quilts**, by Ellen Hernandez

Autograph quilts have been popular since the mid-1800s, often created for auction to raise funds for specific groups or events.



Adeline Harris, 17, from Rhode Island decided to create a *celebrity* autograph quilt in 1856. She sent small silk fabric diamonds to people across the globe and received 360 signatures. She completed the quilt with over 150 different silk fabrics in a

Tumbling Block pattern. Eight US presidents are included as well as Charles Dickens, Longfellow, Emerson, Hawthorne, and Harriet Beecher Stowe. The quilt is now owned by the Metropolitan Museum of Art.



Another teen, Mary Hughes Lord, started making a silk signature quilt in 1860 in Nashville. There are

101 autographs including those of prominent generals and presidents on the centered US flag. The quilt was displayed at Pres. Lincoln's funeral. Lord's daughter donated the quilt to the Smithsonian in 1943.

This celebrity autograph quilt was made in 1954 by and for a little girl named Judy. She was one of the first of Jerry Lewis' "kids" to appear on his televised fund-raising telethon for the Muscular Dystrophy organization. Judy sent solid color cotton squares to pop culture television and radio celebrities of the era for them to autograph. Upon return she gave them to her church group to embroider over the signatures and join the blocks into the completed quilt. It finished as 72" X 90" and much



later was auctioned for the American Folk Art Museum in Sep 2019, donated by NY Americana antique dealer, Laura Fisher. Names include Dwight Eisenhower, Eleanor Roosevelt, Doris Day, Frank Sinatra, Roy Rogers, and John Wayne. The quilt was auctioned again in May 2022.



A 1974 celebrity quilt was made to benefit the Palos Verdes Junior Women's Club in California that supported women and children in crisis. White cotton squares were signed by fifty celebrities including Sonny and Cher, Nixon, Reagan, Bob Hope, and Carol Burnett. The quilt had been in storage until offered for sale online in 2018. It is now offered on ebay for \$50,000. *Block Magazine* featured the quilt in 2022.
