11.2023 Pieces of the Past, 162: Haiti PeaceQuilts, by Ellen Hernandez

Haitian art forms may have originated in the Central African homelands of slaves that were brought to the Caribbean in the 16th century. Embroidered flags with glass beads and sequins symbolizing their religion known as vodou are one of the oldest known Haitian crafted items. Vodou developed from African spirit worship and Catholicism. Haiti is considered the poorest country in Latin America and has suffered corrupt governments and devastating hurricanes and earthquakes. Despite these hardships, Haitians continue to create beautiful traditional art.



In 2006 artist Jeanne Staples turned an appreciation for Haitian embroidered tablecloths into an independent artisan business, *PeaceQuilts*, benefitting women in a challenging environment. Along with master quilter, Maureen McClintock, and other volunteers, Staples gathered supplies and proceeded to teach some Haitian women how to quilt, a new craft for them. Staples imagined that



Haitian embroidery on quilts would be quite marketable, especially in the US. The Haitian women soon became quilters and created a type of echo quilting which bri

Haitian women soon became quilters and created a type of echo quilting which brings movement and charm to their quilts. Eventually co-ops were formed, managed by the local women to create and sell their art quilts, bags, pillows, and jewelry. By 2016 there were six co-ops and about 100 women participating. The non-profit *PeaceQuilts* continues to support the women by marketing their products, supplying equipment, and providing business training. For Haitian women this independence is unusual and provides a safe work environment and an income for them, their families, and their community.

PeaceQuilts have displayed their project and items around the US in places like Martha's Vineyard and the Houston International Quilt Festival. Supplies and fabric may be donated to PeaceQuilts through a Miami contact who will ship them to Haiti. Batiks from 1/8 yard to larger are especially desired as well as embroidery floss, thread, rotary cutters, etc. See https://www.haitipeacequilts.org. Crafted items are at the site for

News from the Quilt Projects Finishing Committee

The Finishing Committee is charged with taking in blocks, tops, quilts, etc. from, primarily, QPC (Quilts Project Committee) and getting them finished for our EOY (Every Other Year) auction. We review the donations, add or subtract what is needed, then package up the projects to check out to members to complete the next phase, either assembly, borders, quilting, or binding. Other sources of our projects are from members and they can come in various levels of completeness.

Occasionally, members hand us blocks or tops at a meeting without us having time to give credit to the donor. Once such donation was a set of 12 blocks based on the Twelve Days of Christmas. I say "based" because this design has, truly, a Christmas theme.

Block 7, Seven Swans a Swimming shows a swan in a snow globe. Block 8, Eight Maids a Milking, has a gingerbread maiden. Block 10, Ten Lords a Leaping, shows Santa leaping over a chimney.

The 11th block, Eleven Pipers Piping just has a snowman on it. I believe it is unfinished. The showman should be holding a pipe or horn. We are calling on all members to check your stash and see if you have this pattern so we can complete the blocks!




