#### 5. 2024 Pieces of the Past, 168: Joe the Quilter, by Ellen Hernandez



Joseph Hedley was born about 1750 and lived in Northumberland, England. He was a tailor by trade and lived in a small cottage with his chickens in Warden. During the Industrial Revolution he became a wellknown quilter and had commissioned work to Scotland, Ireland, and as far away as America. Known as 'Joe the Quilter' he was a skilled

craftsman who designed and quilted with linen and cotton.

One of his quilting patterns became known as 'Old Joe's Chain.' Most of his quilts are now lost but there is one at Bowes Museum in Barnard Castle, two at the Beamish Living Museum of the North in Stanley, and one at Tulle House Museum in Carlisle. Two-thirds of one of the quilts at Beamish was carefully traced for a re-created whole cloth eight-foot square quilt. This quilt had been originally been ordered and bought directly from Joe in 1820 by an English family and passed down through the generations.



Sadly, Joe the quilter's life came to a tragic end. He was brutally murdered in 1826 at the age of 76. His death and the search for the murderers made headlines across the country. A large



reward was offered, but the case was never solved. Some speculated that thieves may have believed rumors that poor Joe had a hidden fortune, and they killed him searching for it.

An archaeological dig on the original site of Joe's cottage gave clues to the exact size and scale. The cottage was recreated by the Beamish Museum using recorded floor plans and information about Joe. The cottage was furnished according to records of an auction of his possessions. You can see a video of the work on YouTube – *The story of Joe the Quilter's cottage*. Local craftsmen used traditional methods

to make the thatched roof with 1400 bales of heather, oak trees were hand felled and shaped into beams and boards, and there were wattle and daub makers constructing the walls (mud and straw.)





Two quilt projects were made for the opening of Joe's cottage. Students and community members made drawings

of things they loved about Northumberland which were made into three quilt panels. Women from the prison in

Durham made a quilt based on a ballad about Joe that was written in the 1800s. Fun fact: The Beamish has a collection of 350 historical quilts.


#### Looking for a New Orleans Quilter

#### What is this Block of the Month Drawing?

Beginning in May, 2023 as a fun way to use up scraps, share some quilt block ideas, and offer members a head start of getting a quilt top going – monthly Guild meetings have featured a Block of the Month Drawing.

In April 2023, an instruction sheet for the May Two Step block was distributed at the meeting and posted in the PDF section of the Guild website. Members were encouraged to make as many Two Step blocks as they liked, knowing that for every block submitted they got a chance to win ALL the blocks turned in. No restrictions applied to what the winner could do with the blocks – use them for a quilt of their own, create a charity quilt, let them sit in their UFO box waiting for inspiration to strike. "The Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo Prizewinners exhibit is a vibrant celebration of Texas culture. And one of the fascinating aspects of this annual event—one of Houston's biggest and most beloved—is the Quilt Contest.

The Contest is divided into Adult and Youth categories. The Museum will display the

"The quilts are confirmation that the art of quilting is still very much alive in Texas, celebrating both the rich history of the art form and the applications of many traditional techniques and styles onto contemporary quilts," says Museum Curator Vicki Mangum. "You'll be impressed by the workmanship and beauty of these winners—from all age levels!"

There's also a sampling of talented works from promising young student artists at La Grange High School. Guided by Art Teacher Jack Vollbaum, the students were charged with creating "Western Art." All of the pieces were finalists for judging, and some went-on to win Gold Medals or Blue Ribbons at the 2024 Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo.

and we are so pleased to have this exhibit!" Mangum adds.

KHAYAMIYAS AND THE TENTMAKERS OF CAIRO

Somewhere in the maze that is Cairo's market district, there's a narrow lane winding between rows of tightly packed buildings, known as Khan Khayamiya, or Street of the Tentmakers. The narrow street is busy, noisy, and bustling with pedestrians, bicycles, small delivery trucks, and local residents going about their everyday business. Spilling out onto the sidewalks are rolls, heaps and bundles of multicoloured, richly designed tent panels, hand-stitched by the shopkeepers and tentmakers of this small Egyptian community.
