



# Master Sergeant Shannon Moore was presented the 2024 Veteran's Quilt.

#### Ida B.'s Quilting Guild Enrichment SCHOLARSHIP Fund

#### One MISSION of GSAQG

• To stimulate an interest in guilts and to advance the art of guiltmaking.



Recognizing the importance of active participation in quilt guild events and activities, Ida Blankenship Kujawski has provided funds to establish a Scholarship Account. This scholarship fund will enable guild members to apply for financial assistance to cover fees for workshops and retreats, further encouraging engagement and skill development within our community.

#### **PURPOSE**

- Enhance Guild Membership Experience: Foster greater enjoyment of guild membership by promoting skill development and friendships through active participation in guild activities.
- Encourage Participation: Motivate members to attend workshops and retreats, enhancing their skills and connections within the guild.
- Financial Support: Provide financial assistance to members who may be on a tight budget, helping to alleviate the costs associated with workshops and retreats.
- Establish a Donation Fund: Create a Scholarship Fund that can receive additional donations in the future. These donations can come from anyone for various reasons, further supporting the guild's activities and members.

#### **ELIGIBILITY**

- Applicant must be active member of GSAQG for the (1) year preceding the date of the event.
- Special consideration to "First-time attendee"
- Scholarships for guild workshops and retreats are available each year. Workshop required kit fee provided by instructor could be included in Scholarship amount.
- Guild Workshops offered as 2 sessions (Friday/Saturday) would qualify for two scholarships, to help two members.
- One scholarship per member in a calendar year.
- Scholarship recipients are ineligible to reapply for:
  - 3 years for Winter or Summer Retreat
  - 2 years for Mini-Retreats
  - 2 years for Guild Speakers' workshops

Paper copy of Applications available by chair at onset of enrollment.

Applications must be submitted to the individual retreat chair, or guild program chair, who will present to the guild board for final approval. Each chair should have committee of 2-3 to help evaluate applications.

Applications should be submitted at beginning of enrollment for each event. Awards can then be announced early enough to allow recipients and chair to plan accordingly.



#### 12.2024 Pieces of the Past, 175: Georgia Bonesteel, by Ellen Hernandez



In the 1980s I enjoyed watching quilter Georgia Bonesteel on her PBS show, "Lap Quilting." My mother knew how much I liked quilting and whenever Georgia had a new book, I could count on a surprise copy from mother on a birthday or Christmas. I recall trying to make a Christmas tree skirt for my mother-in-law using Georgia's *Sew and Extend* method from one of her books. It was so

frustrating and I couldn't make heads or tails of the process. I decided to write Georgia (snail mail back then) and told her I had trouble sleeping at night trying to solve this quilt mystery. She promptly replied and even included a miniature quilt sample to explain (I still have the letter.) I always thought that was going

above and beyond for a busy professional artist. I was able to finish my quilt and my mother-in-law loved it. Where's Georgia now?





Georgia Jinkinson Bonesteel was born in Iowa during the Depression. Her father was a federal prosecutor which resulted in the family relocating frequently. Georgia attended 13 different schools. She learned to sew from her mother and began making garments. She majored in Home Ec. at Iowa State and Northwestern Univ. Her husband,



Pete, worked for Shell Oil and the family moved several times. While living in New Orleans, Georgia worked as a seamstress for a tv show "Sewing is Fun." After receiving a gift of tie fabric, she created quilted evening bags and sold them in the French Quarter. A move to North Carolina required a pivot and Georgia started teaching a quilting class at Blue Ridge Community College. She had never made a full-sized quilt at the time. It wasn't long before

she developed her own lap quilting process and sold the idea to NC PBS in 1978. Her show aired for 12 seasons, and the rest is history. Georgia and Pete bought a hardware store in Hendersonville NC – half a shop for now retired Pete and half a shop for quilting. Georgia wrote many quilting books and sold quilt related items. Her last book was *Scrap Happy Quilts* in 2019 which includes history of family and antique furniture.






















Georgia's lap quilting method is a quilt-as-you-go plan to quilt one block at a time. She is primarily a hand quilter and her lap work fits nicely in a hoop rather than a cumbersome floor frame. Before the longarm fad this method helped quilters finish larger projects in a timely manner by hand or machine quilting.

In 1985 Georgia had a non-malignant brain tumor removed. She recovered quickly and even with minor facial weakness she got back to the quilting circuit. In 2005 she and son Paul, a filmmaker, produced the documentary *The Great American Quilt Revival* which features quilters, historians, and collectors discussing the revolutions of quilting.





Georgia founded three quilt guilds. She invented *Grid Grip*, a quarter-inch grid printed on freezer paper for quilt drafting and paper piecing. Her guiding passion was to teach, and she did that quite calmly and confidently. Her college classes and seminars across the country have always been well received and attended.

#### Where do you sew? by Jeannette Jay

Back in my single days, when I could afford it, I would look for a 2-bedroom apartment just so I could have a sewing/craft room. When I bought my 2-bedroom house in the early 1980's, I had my sewing room. I held onto that room as long as I could, but eventually I had to let my son have it. I was regulated to a small desk in the laundry room, but I made it work. I could still sew.

It wasn't long until I was able to claim an efficiency apartment that was over our old garage, circa mid 1990's. We built an apartment behind that structure for my mother, and she didn't want anyone above her. Except me! While it was detached from the main house, and it was upstairs, it was my very own space. It had a bathroom, air conditioning, a small kitchen, and plenty of room for sewing. I even had a small desk for Son to do his homework.

But, like before, Son got the better of me. By the time he was a senior in high school we switched spaces, and I got the front bedroom again and he moved to the efficiency. At least I was back in the house with hubby, no

stairs, and all the comforts of home. Even after Son left for college, I kept his apartment for him even after graduation and he came back home. My sewing stayed in the front bedroom. It was smaller than the apartment, but I could still sew.

Around 2010, we added a large room to the back of the house. By 2012, I moved my sewing operation to this big room. It still had a sub floor, unpainted walls, and was a bit rough, but I made it work. Might as well, money was tight to finish it any other way. Oh well!!!!

Then life took a bad turn. In 2019, my dear mother, who still lived in her apartment behind my house, passed away suddenly. It was a numbing time while we planned her funeral, started cleaning her place and divvying up her belongings to

family and close friends. While visiting with Son one day, I mentioned dad (DH) and I had been discussing what to do with Grans apartment, do we rent it, save it for family, what? Without hesitation, he said to make it my studio!

I discussed it with DH, made up some floor plan sketches, and the plan took off like a freight train! We took out a wall, painted, stripped up the carpet and stained the concrete floor. I moved in all my sewing furniture, added some more (I had the room!), and made myself quite at home. By early 2020, I was up and running! It can be a double-edged sword at times. I miss being in the house with DH, but I also like being in my own world out here. We made the best of a bad experience, and I'm reminded of my mother every day I'm in her place. I know she would be proud.

#### GREATER SAN ANTONIO QUILT GUILD, INC ETHEL Y. HOWEY GRANT PROGRAM

#### MISSION

The Greater San Antonio Quilt Guild (GSAQG) has established a grant program in honor of a loved and esteemed founding member, Ethel Y. Howey, whose accomplishments and influence extended into the international quilt world. The grant is to encourage the pursuit of education in the study of quilt making and to recognize the importance of quilting in today's society as an art form, as an instrument of healing, as part of our legacy, and as a common thread which binds all in friendship.

#### PURPOSE

The purpose of the grant program is to fund projects that will have long term impact on preserving the heritage and further the art of quilt making. The grant may be used to cover expenses such as fees (including conferences, workshops, etc.), travel, lodging, meals, materials, and books. The grant(s) will be awarded in even numbered years, not to exceed \$2,000. The Grant Committee may divide the monies between more than one recipient. The GSAQG is not obligated to award the entire \$2,000 or any part thereof, if the quality of the proposals does not merit it.

#### **ELIBILITY**

- Applicant must be an active GSAQG member in good standing for the previous two (2) years immediately preceding the grant deadline.
- An applicant must show evidence of an interest in continuing to improve and innovate in the field of quilt design, construction, history, or technique.
- Financial need will NOT be a criterion for selection.
- Grant recipients are ineligible to reapply for grants for four years. Grant committee members are ineligible for grants while serving on the committee.

#### PROCEDURES AND DEADLINES

- Applications must be submitted on or before August 1 (current year), and the grant will be awarded at the following January Guild meeting.
- If the recipient fails to fulfill the requirements or is unable to attend the proposed project or program, the grant money must be returned within **three (3) months** of the cancellation, or on a timeline agreed to by the committee and the applicant. If an alternate applicant is available, the money may be transferred to the alternate with approval of the committee.
- Recipients must be willing and able to share with GSAQG the new skills, techniques, or information gained. This may be in
  the form of a presentation, a workshop, or other process that disseminates the information to the members in the year
  following receipt of the grant. Scheduling must be coordinated with the 1st Vice President for Programs.
- If a workshop or program is being presented, at a minimum of three (3) months before the scheduled Guild workshop or
  program, a lesson plan and class sample will be presented to the Ethel Y. Howey Chairperson, the 1<sup>st</sup> Vice President for
  Programs, and one Guild member-at-large.
- Recipient must submit, in writing, a final report of the project and expenses by March 1 of the year following receipt of the
  grant.

#### **GSAQG ETHEL Y. HOWEY GRANT PROGRAM APPLICATION PROCESS**

Following the stated timeline, submit a typed or handwritten application, not to exceed two (2) pages. Include the date, your name, address, phone numbers, email, number of years a GSAQG member, and explain:

- Why you would like to receive this grant.
- 2. How you will use the grant funds, including a specific budget.
- 3. How you will share your new skills, techniques, and information with the membership.

Feel free to provide any additional information that will help the selection committee.
