President's Letter

Common Threads

March is one of my favorite months of the year. When else does a math geek get to celebrate Pi day? What is Pi day you ask? Well, it is 3/14! So why does this have to do with math, and much more importantly quilting? So Pi is the ratio 22/7 (or 3.14) which represents the relationship of the diameter of a circle and the circumference of the circle. We can use the Fibonacci Sequence or the Golden Ratio as a way to decide the sizes of borders of a quilt. We can use a ratio to dilate the size of a block to either a larger or smaller size.

Did you know that March is the least productive month of the year for businesses? And do you know why? Sorry but I am going to keep you in suspense until the guild meeting! Hopefully that won't be the case for us since March 15th is National Quilting Day. I can't wait to see what you finish during National Quilting Day at the April Bring and Brag!



Monthly Spotlight Bright Hopes

The Bright Hopes Committee is one of the many committees of the Greater San Antonio Quilt Guild. The Bright Hopes Committee, comprised of **Frances Contreras, Becky Zoellich and Jay Beatty**, prepares quilt and tote bag kits so members can complete them before the next quilt guild meeting.

Each month, we donate 10 large quilts and 15 tote bags to the Roy Maas Youth Alternatives. Roy Maas Youth Alternatives, or RMYA, is an organization that provides support and clinical services to children who have been through severe trauma and neglect due to sexual, physical or emotional abuse.

This year we will continue making quilts and tote bags and delivering them to RMYA. We would like some quilts oriented towards girls and some for boys and they should be nonreligious. The size should be between 50-60 inches wide and 70-75 inches long. You may help by piecing quilt tops, hand quilting, tieing quilts, machine quilt, sew on binding, sew on labels, or donate fabric.

After Action regarding Annie Smith February Presentation, by Ellen Hernandez

Did you catch Annie Smith's reference to the **John C. Campbell Folk School**? Check out my *Pieces of the Past* article from February 2024 in the Guild online archives to learn more about the school. I even featured one of Annie's quilts.

When Annie asked the audience if a misshapen or otherwise imperfect block could be used in a quilt, she expected a resounding response of "no." I could only envision attendees rushing home to throw out troublesome quilt blocks. Hopefully quilters, especially the newbies, didn't take Annie's appeal completely to heart. For a judged quilt, that odd block may not work. For most of us, not every quilt is going to be a masterpiece. I view an oopsie block as a challenge, determined to find a way to make it work, like solving a puzzle. Quilting should be a fun adventure, full of trials and errors - not always a goal of perfection for a Blue-Ribbon quilt. Out of all the quilts I have made in the last forty plus years, less than twenty have been juried into national quilt shows. All the others have been good quality for family, friends, myself, or donation. Your quilting story may be similar.

What about those obscure and abandoned quilt blocks? For the last few years I have been turning them into usable and colorful quilts. Not 'Quilt Show' quality, but appropriate for organizations serving children or seniors in need with emotional, situational, or health issues. If you have some unwanted, wonky, imperfect quilt blocks, consider donating them



to me to turn into something unique. I hope you continue to enjoy your quilting journey. Happy Quilting!





3.2025 Pieces of the Past, 178: Necchi Sewing Machines, by Ellen Hernandez





Have you made a spur of the moment purchase? I did late last year after viewing an item on Facebook market. It just popped up on my page. I didn't go searching, although I had been interested in a cabinet for another machine that sits on a shelf. I quickly bought the 1950s Necchi BF straight stitch (an offer I couldn't refuse) and drove across town to pick it up.

The owner said the machine worked and she had used it for many years. The cabinet has a 'secret' – when the front is pulled open it reveals the knee control. *Necchi* was new to me, so I had to do a little research.

Ambrogio Necchi inherited the family foundry in 1880 in Pavia, Italy, twenty-five miles from Milan. His son, Vittorio, took



over the company after WWI in 1919. Vittorio converted the foundry to create a sewing machine for his wife in 1924 and then started a company that grew to be internationally recognized for sewing machines of high quality and durability. The early machines were hand powered and

straight stitch only, based on a Singer 15. The domestic and industrial machines were built with metal parts and worked well on heavier fabrics. All the parts, including the

cabinet, were made by Necchi. Machines were exported to thirty countries. Vittorio's first home sewing machine with zig-zag stitches, the BU model, was developed in 1932, twenty years before Singer machines. In the 1940s there were 4,500 Necchi employees producing 1,000 machines per day. The Necchi BU model cost \$279 in 1947, equivalent to over \$4,000 today.

Necchi employee Leon Jolson escaped Nazi persecution in Poland during World War II and came to America, convincing



Vittorio to distribute Necchi in the US. Post-war housewives loved the cam model that provided a variety of stitches and embroidery patterns. Leon also sold Elna sewing machines. Relying on the good quality of these two brands, Leon imported less expensive copycat Nelco machines from Japan in 1953 and sold them as Necchi/Elna. He was sued many times over this infringement and yet he became a millionaire and philanthropist. Many of his "fake" Necchi machines are sold today on eBay and other sites often marked with "Necchi Sewing Machine Sales Corp."

Sophia Loren was the spokesperson for the chic Necchi 1954 modern *Supernova* model, a curvy design unlike traditional boxy machines. This style had a built-in needle threader.



The 1956 *Mirella* model was award winning in industrial design and one machine is on

permanent exhibit at the Museum of Modern Art in NY. Many other models

were produced over the years, all labeled "made in Italy." The *Nora, Leila* and a few other models were available in pink, and the Supernova *Julia* was lavender.

Vittorio had no children and after his death in 1975 the company was sold and production moved to Taiwan and Japan. Janome purchased the rights to use the name Necchi and



continues production and sales today using that logo. This is a 2019 model released for the 100-year anniversary.

The original factory in Pavia is in ruins. A regeneration project is underway to develop the area into living spaces, offices, gardens, and a cycle and pedestrian route.



GREATER SAN ANTONIO QUILT GUILD, INC ETHEL Y. HOWEY GRANT PROGRAM

MISSION

The Greater San Antonio Quilt Guild (GSAQG) has established a grant program in honor of a loved and esteemed founding member, Ethel Y. Howey, whose accomplishments and influence extended into the international quilt world. The grant is to encourage the pursuit of education in the study of quilt making and to recognize the importance of quilting in today's society as an art form, as an instrument of healing, as part of our legacy, and as a common thread which binds all in friendship. **PURPOSE**

The purpose of the grant program is to fund projects that will have long term impact on preserving the heritage and further the art of quilt making. The grant may be used to cover expenses such as fees (including conferences, workshops, etc.), travel, lodging, meals, materials, and books. The grant(s) will be awarded in even numbered years, not to exceed \$2,000. The Grant Committee may divide the monies between more than one recipient. The GSAQG is not obligated to award the entire \$2,000 or any part thereof, if the quality of the proposals does not merit it.

ELIBILITY

- Applicant must be an active GSAQG member in good standing for the previous **two (2) years** immediately preceding the grant deadline.
- An applicant must show evidence of an interest in continuing to improve and innovate in the field of quilt design, construction, history, or technique.
- Financial need will NOT be a criterion for selection.
- Grant recipients are ineligible to reapply for grants for four years. Grant committee members are ineligible for grants while serving on the committee.

PROCEDURES AND DEADLINES

- Applications must be submitted **on or before August 1** (current year), and the grant will be awarded at the following January Guild meeting.
- If the recipient fails to fulfill the requirements or is unable to attend the proposed project or program, the grant money must be returned within **three (3) months** of the cancellation, or on a timeline agreed to by the committee and the applicant. If an alternate applicant is available, the money may be transferred to the alternate with approval of the committee.
- Recipients must be willing and able to share with GSAQG the new skills, techniques, or information gained. This may be in the form of a presentation, a workshop, or other process that disseminates the information to the members in **the year** following receipt of the grant. Scheduling must be coordinated with the 1st Vice President for Programs.
- If a workshop or program is being presented, at a minimum of three (3) months before the scheduled Guild workshop or program, a lesson plan and class sample will be presented to the Ethel Y. Howey Chairperson, the 1st Vice President for Programs, and one Guild member-at-large.
- Recipient must submit, in writing, a final report of the project and expenses by March 1 of the year following receipt of the grant.

GSAQG ETHEL Y. HOWEY GRANT PROGRAM APPLICATION PROCESS

Following the stated timeline, submit a typed or handwritten application, not to exceed two (2) pages. Include the date, your name, address, phone numbers, email, number of years a GSAQG member, and explain:

- 1. Why you would like to receive this grant.
- 2. How you will use the grant funds, including a specific budget.
- 3. How you will share your new skills, techniques, and information with the membership.

- Special consideration to "First-time attendee"
- Scholarships for guild workshops and retreats are available each year. Workshop required kit fee provided by instructor could be included in Scholarship amount.
- Guild Workshops offered as 2 sessions (Friday/Saturday) would qualify for two scholarships, to help two members.
- One scholarship per member in a calendar year.
- Scholarship recipients are ineligible to reapply for:
 - 3 years for Winter or Summer Retreat
 - 2 years for Mini-Retreats
 - 2 years for Guild Speakers' workshops

Paper copy of Applications available by chair at onset of enrollment.

Applications must be submitted to the individual retreat chair, or guild program chair, who will present to the guild board for final approval. Each chair should have committee of 2-3 to help evaluate applications.

Applications should be submitted at beginning of enrollment for each event. Awards can then be announced early enough to allow recipients and chair to plan accordingly.
