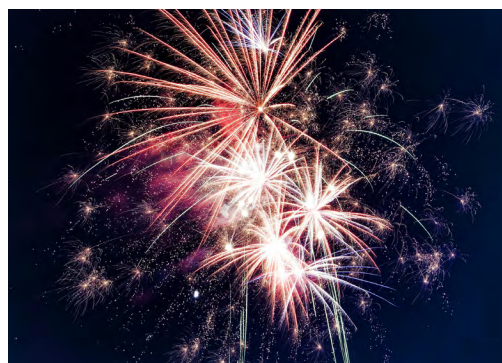
President's Letter

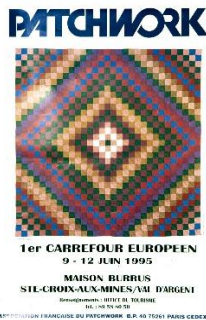

1.2026 Pieces of the Past, 188: **Le Carrefour Européen du Patchwork**, by Ellen Hernandez



In Alsace, France in 1693 Jakob Amann split from the religious order of Mennonites creating a group called the Amish who wanted a simpler, more isolated lifestyle. Many Amish eventually left European religious intolerance and settled in the US, transporting their many skills as hard working artisans. Amish communities remain interspersed primarily throughout Pennsylvania, Ohio, and Indiana. Most quilters are familiar with the distinct style of traditional Amish quilts using vivid solid-colored fabrics and intricate hand quilting. These characteristics exemplify their principles of thrift, patience, and community.



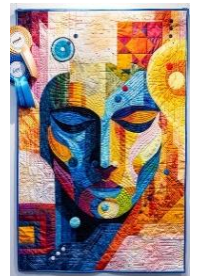
In the 1980s a Swiss couple, journalist Jacques Légeret and wife Catherine travelled to Philadelphia seeking specialized care for their disabled son, David. They were surprised to be welcomed with open arms by an Amish group a few hours out of the city. The Amish believed God had entrusted a special child, David, to the Légeret's care and they were a privileged family. Over many years of travelling back to the US Jacques studied Amish history and introduced Amish quilts to his Swiss community. He wrote many articles and three books on the subjects. In 1993 during the 300th

anniversary of the Amish movement Jacques was a guest speaker about quilts at a symposium in Sainte-Marie-Aux-Mines, Alsace. Some quilts from Jacques' Amish collection were displayed. There was great



interest in the Amish and Mennonite history and quilting and in 1995 the first *Carrefour* (crossroads patchwork meeting) event was held. Bernina was instrumental in advertising and establishing the event. It was quite successful with lots of interest in textile art.

The Carrefour event grew over the years with guest quilt artists from around the world, vendor markets, workshops, and exhibits. These events took place in historic buildings and churches in four Alsace villages about 9 miles apart, offering free shuttle buses. The event continues today over four days every September showcasing more than 1,000 works. Amish quilts are still included but a variety of modern quilts are featured as well. Thirty quilts are juried into an international themed contest every year and later exhibited for ten months throughout the world. The 2026 theme is '*Habitat*' with a deadline of 15 May. Size is about 31.5" x 47", no leather allowed – see <https://patchwork-europe.eu/en/the-international-contest-habitat/> for all the rules. One 2025 winner was France's Sandrine Ostermann, *Humanizing AI*.



David Légeret, the impetus for Carrefour, passed away in 2024. He had been unable to speak and was confined to a wheelchair. He suffered from spasms and his hands were often tense and closed. Despite all this, with the assistance of an art therapist, David painted and published a book, *Painting the Invisible*. Using facilitated communication methods, David spoke up for those, like him, who could not speak traditionally and advocated for their fundamental right to expression.



Jacques and his friend, Hans Zogg, together hold the largest collection of Amish quilts in Europe and continue to display them around the world.

Ida B.'s Quilting Guild Enrichment SCHOLARSHIP Fund



One MISSION of GSAQG

- To stimulate an interest in quilts and to advance the art of quiltmaking.

Recognizing the importance of active participation in quilt guild events and activities, Ida Blankenship Kujawski has provided funds to establish a Scholarship Account. This scholarship fund will enable guild members to apply for financial assistance to cover fees for workshops and retreats, further encouraging engagement and skill development within our community.

PURPOSE

- Enhance Guild Membership Experience: Foster greater enjoyment of guild membership by promoting skill development and friendships through active participation in guild activities.
- Encourage Participation: Motivate members to attend workshops and retreats, enhancing their skills and connections within the guild.
- Financial Support: Provide financial assistance to members who may be on a tight budget, helping to alleviate the costs associated with workshops and retreats.
- Establish a Donation Fund: Create a Scholarship Fund that can receive additional donations in the future. These donations can come from anyone for various reasons, further supporting the guild's activities and members.

ELIGIBILITY

- Applicant must be active member of GSAQG for the (1) year preceding the date of the event.
- Special consideration to "First-time attendee"
- Scholarships for guild workshops and retreats are available each year. Workshop required kit fee provided by instructor could be included in Scholarship amount.
- Guild Workshops offered as 2 sessions (Friday/Saturday) would qualify for two scholarships, to help two members.
- One scholarship per member in a calendar year.
- Scholarship recipients are ineligible to reapply for:
 - 3 years for Winter or Summer Retreat
 - 2 years for Mini-Retreats
 - 2 years for Guild Speakers' workshops

Paper copy of Applications available by chair at onset of enrollment.

Applications must be submitted to the individual retreat chair, or guild program chair, who will present to the guild board for final approval. Each chair should have committee of 2-3 to help evaluate applications.

Applications should be submitted at beginning of enrollment for each event. Awards can then be announced early enough to allow recipients and chair to plan accordingly.
