President's Letter

The other day, I was asked :”What kind of quilter are you?” And you know, it took me back for a minute. How do I answer that question? Do I talk about the size of the quilt - bed quilts, wall hangings, or what about the bags and other items we make? Do I talk about the process I like the best - the designing, piecing, EPP, paper piecing, applique, embroidery or the final quilting? Do I talk about what is done by machine or by hand? Do I talk about the style of quilt - traditional, modern, art? What about the fabrics we use - cottons, wool, flannel, silk?

And after all of that, I still had questions to ask! Do I like to quilt alone or with a group? Do you quilt in silence or listen to music or have a movie playing in the background? Are you a stay at home person or do you attend retreats? Do you shop hop? Do you buy your fabric based on a designer, by the color or the prints? Do you pick your own fabrics or go for the kit? Is your pet your assistant as you sew?

So in the end, after a lot of thinking, my answer was “yes to all of the above (except for the 1 project at a time)!”

We will have Carol Thelan present a program at the August 8 meeting. Carol developed a program called "Quilt Notes". We're thrilled to announce the addition of over 70 brand-new fabric calculators, expanding our collection to cover more than 200 quilt blocks. These calculators are designed to simplify your quilting process by helping you figure out exactly how much fabric you need for each block.

This latest update is especially exciting because it completes our coverage of the first quarter of blocks from the 2023 Block of the Day Video series. Now, all 90 blocks from January through March have dedicated calculators to guide your fabric planning, cutting, and shopping.

- Precision: Get exact fabric measurements for each block size.
- Time-saving: Skip tedious math and focus on sewing.

Quilt As You Go

Supply List for Ann Moore Class

Ruler Kit including glue kit \$35.00

Fabric Kit (optional) \$20.00

Fabric needed if fabric kit not purchased from Ann

Eight 10 inch squares of fabric

Four 10 inch squares of batting

One 1/8th yard of fabric that is cut width of fabric 4.5 to 6 inches by 42 to 44

Additional supplies needed

Sewing machine in good working order

Ruler foot and 1/4 inch foot (I have ruler feet to loan)

Thread, polyester or cotton, doesn't matter

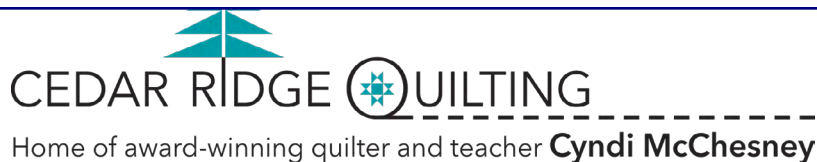
Small iron and ironing board, shared station is fine

Cutting mat and rotary cutter, shared is fine

Cutting ruler for cutting sashing

We will be making 4 very simple ruler work blocks to put together. Using this method you can keep adding sets of 4 and make a quilt as large as you would like. I will have several quilts to display using the Quilt As You Go method. As you know, all of my work is done on a domestic machine and I have found this method works the best for me.

Panel – of course! Bring a panel you would like to work with – any style is great. Pre-washing is recommended.

Any style panel is great - single image, multiple same-size images or a panel with several different sized sections for a more challenging design process.

Calculator

Design surface or portable design wall (optional)

Camera or cell phone with camera feature

Books or magazines or other sources for lots of block ideas

iPad or laptop for design inspiration

Scrap paper for rough sketching of ideas as well as doing math and taking notes.

Mechanical pencil

Colored pencils

Coordinating fabrics - optional

Graph paper - 4 to the inch - I prefer Bienfang 11 x 17 or larger

School ruler - not a rotary cutting ruler

Rotary cutter, mat, square ruler larger than the frames in your panel (except single image panels)

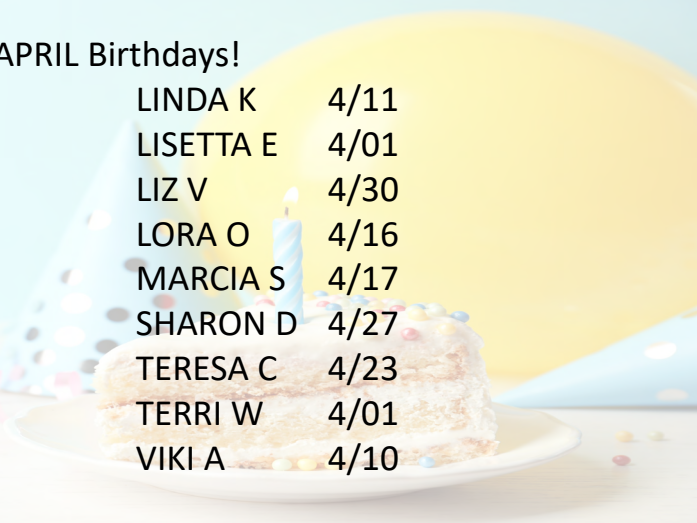

4.2026 Pieces of the Past, 191: **Cheater Cloth**, by Ellen Hernandez

Fabric printed to look like pieced patchwork has been referred to as faux patchwork, geometrical chintz, pre-printed patchwork, and cheater cloth. This is a cotton piece from my mother's stash, probably from the early 1960s. It's labeled 'Montgomery Ward, 36 inches wide, 39 cents per yard.' I'm not sure how Mother used it originally, perhaps for pillows. She enjoyed many handcrafts, but unlike her mother, grandmother, and aunts she did not quilt.



It is not clear when the first printed patchwork fabrics were made. This late 1700s English pieced and quilted coverlet with a pre-printed sawtooth border is at The Metropolitan Museum of Art. Another late 1700s print is held in the Zuiderzee Museum, Netherlands. It is a triangular fichu (neckcloth.) Patchwork was quite popular in the Netherlands at this time and triangles were a



particular favorite. Two block printed strips from the early 1800s were used as borders.



For those 'Janiacs' who are followers of the Jane Stickle 1863 Civil War quilt, it may be surprising to know that two of her blocks used cheater cloth, B-13 and J-13.



Cochecho Mills of Dover NH produced many popular designs starting in the 1870s, some in different colorways, found in vintage quilts. Their patterns of stars and hexagons were often used as a 'fussy-cut' center for whole quilts. The demand for these



prints reached Japan, Argentina, and Canada. They profited from including themes from current events such as the Centennial Exposition, America's Cup race, the operetta H.M.S. Pinafore, etc., often resembling Victorian 'crazy quilts.'



Many modern designers of reproduction fabrics have created cheater cloth such as Jo Morton for Andover Fabrics, Judie Rothermel, Betsy Chutchian for Moda, and Julie Hendrickson. Those new to quilting enjoy using cheater fabric for the quick assembly of totes and small quilts and they are great for practicing machine quilting. With the popularity of making quilt jackets, current cheater fabrics such as those by Riley Blake are even more popular. Cheater prints can also be used as backings. Try some printed patchwork – it's not cheating, it's historical!

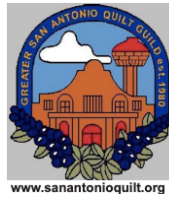
